

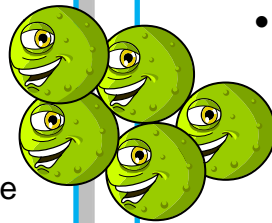
### How did Scotland become involved in e-Bug?

The Scottish Government HAI Policy Unit requested that HPS lead the coordination of e-Bug in Scotland. This built upon work undertaken by the Scottish Government and Education Scotland to ensure that there is alignment with the e-Bug resources with the Scottish Curriculum for Excellence.



### How have we implemented e-Bug in Scotland?

- e-Bug has been promoted via:
  - GLOW website,
  - STEM BLOG (Education Scotland), and
  - HPS Website.
- e-Bug leaflets and posters have been created and shared via the HPS website and at events to key stakeholders.
- Making promotional materials including pens and stickers available for key stakeholders to promote e-bug locally



### What challenges have we faced and how have we overcome them?

- Limited level of support from Education colleagues – e-Bug shared via School Newsletters to Education bodies and shared via their websites GLOW and STEMBLOG.
- Limited resources - restricted HPS in what promotional materials that could be produced.
  - HPS produced e-Bug leaflets and posters and hosted these on the website for stakeholders to download by way of promoting the resource.
  - Unable to translate the resources into Gaelic versions in the first year.

### What do we want from e-Bug in the future?

- Same level of useful resources
- More interactive games
- More student and teacher videos
